




Before beginning the **Daily Care & Activities**, complete sensor and app setup by following the **Setup Instructions** included in your kit.




## Daily Tasks on Phone

Example shown – Your screens may differ


#### Begin CareProgram™




Select each item listed under "Daily Items" to answer question(s) from your healthcare provider.

#### **Check Connection**




From Activity Center, tap ≡ icon to open the menu. Tap "Live" to view your live data from your sensor.

If your sensor is applied correctly and connected, you will see your live data with numbers.


## Caring for Your Sensors





Remove the old tape Pee leaving sensor in place

Peel new tape from backing and attach to sensor




Attach sensor to finger



Peel the remaining tape off backing


## Check Sensor Battery

If battery light is orange or red, it's time to change your sensor.



#### Changing Your Sensor

- 1. First remove the sensor from your wrist and finger
- 2. Remove the chip from your old sensor by pressing down on the red tab
- 3. Follow the "How to Apply Your Sensor" section on the **Setup Instructions** included in your kit





Save the Chip! You will use it again shortly.

### Other Sensor Tips

- Remove the sensor when you shower but you can leave it on when you wash your hands.
- Replace sensor tape once a day. You can change it more often if the tape gets dirty, wet, or no longer sticks.
- Change the sensor if battery light is orange or red.
